



STABLE GATE ACCESS & EQUINE PICKUP POLICY

To ensure strict biosecurity control, liability protection, and full traceability of all racehorses housed on the backside, the Stable Gate operates under absolute security protocols. No horse transport vehicle is permitted entry or exit without complete verification.

1. MANDATED GATE CHECK-IN REQUIREMENTS

Upon arriving at the secure Stable Gate to pick up an outgoing horse, all transport drivers and commercial operators must provide the security officer on duty with the following information before being allowed access:

- **Authorized Identification:** A valid Racing License or state/government-issued photo identification for every vehicle occupant.
- **Transport Logistics:** The name of the shipping company or the individual truck/trailer owner operating the transport.
- **Equine Target Information:** The exact registered racing name of the horse (barn names, pet names, or stable nicknames are strictly unacceptable).
- **Precise Location:** The designated barn letter and trainer name where the horse is currently stabled.
- **Scheduled Pickup Authorization:** Verification that the pickup is aligned with a pre-arranged schedule filed by the licensed trainer or authorized stable agent.

2. INBOUND AND OUTBOUND PROCEDURAL FLOW

Step A (Gate Arrival): Driver halts at the Stable Gate. Security logs the arrival timestamp, checks credentials, and verifies the horse pickup request against the trainer manifest.

Step B (Backside Transit): Once cleared, the vehicle must proceed directly to the designated barn using authorized perimeter roads only. Speed limit is strictly enforced at 10 MPH.

Step C (Gate Departure & Verification): Before leaving the facility, the vehicle must halt at the outbound lane. Security will cross-reference the physical paperwork (Out-Slip, Health Certificate/Coggins, and Digital Tattoo/Microchip confirmation) against the physical equine cargo in the trailer.

3. RESTRICTED HOURS & OFF-HOUR TRANSPORTS

Standard transport operations are permitted at any hour with properly filed pickup authorization form. Failure to provide proper documentation may result in being held at the gate or denied entry.

ENFORCEMENT AND COMPLIANCE PENALTIES

Failure to provide the mandatory identification, horse details, or authorized stable documentation will result in immediate denial of gate entry. Any attempt to bypass security, falsify documents, or remove a horse without explicit trainer and security clearance will result in permanent revocation of track access privilege and an immediate referral to the New York State Gaming Commission for disciplinary action.
